



## 1 Cathedral Junction

Cathedral Junction is home to the Christchurch Attractions Booking Office and is close to cafés, shops and many of the city's best hotels.



## 2 Cathedral Square

See the restoration of Christ Church Cathedral, Tūrangā Library, Te Pae Christchurch Convention Centre and the many eateries.



## 3 Mill Island & The Terrace

The Terrace complex hosts an array of bars and restaurants. The revitalised banks of the Avon River are an ideal spot to relax.



## 4 Riverside Market

Riverside Market features a wide range of eateries, shops and stalls selling various local produce. The ornate Bridge of Remembrance is a favourite photo spot.



## 5 Ballantynes

The pedestrian mall of Cashel Street hosts a great selection of shops and cafés, including the iconic Ballantynes department store.



## 6 The Crossing

At the point where the tram lines cross over, visitors have easy access to the shops and eateries along High Street or the Cashel Street.



## 7 SALT District

This stop offers a fantastic variety of exciting hospitality venues along Poplar Lane, High Street and the Little High complex in the city's SALT District.



## 8 Manchester Street

Here visitors will find a range of nearby shops, bars and restaurants to explore, as well as access to several hotels.



## 9 High Street

Christchurch's unique Transitional Cardboard Cathedral is a two-block walk along Hereford Street. This area also hosts many shops and eateries.



## 10 Worceter Bridge

An ideal stop to explore the Avon River precinct along the riverbanks. This stop is also home to Punting on the Avon's Worceter Bridge landing.



## 11 Art Gallery

Visit the Christchurch Art Gallery, featuring local and international art. Enjoy a coffee or glass of wine at one of the many cafés and bars nearby.



## 12 Arts Centre

From this stop explore the boutique stores, character shops, cinema and eateries of the restored historic Arts Centre complex.



## 13 Museum & Botanic Gardens

Disembark here for Punting on the Avon, a short walk away at the historic Antigua Boat Sheds. The Canterbury Museum and Botanic Gardens are also popular spots.



## 14 Hagley Park

From here visitors can access North Hagley Park, the venue for many city events and a popular recreation site.



## 15 Cranmer Square

One of several grassed squares surrounding the central city, Cranmer Square is a place for rest and relaxation.



## 16 Quake City

Visit Quake City, an exhibition detailing the 2010 and 2011 Christchurch earthquakes and aftermath. Also nearby are the Christchurch Casino and Victoria Street hospitality precinct.



## 17 Victoria Square

This area is ideal for relaxing alongside the Avon River. This central stop provides access to Te Pae Christchurch Convention Centre as well as to the Christchurch Town Hall.



## 18 New Regent Street

Indulge in a sweet treat, coffee or meal at the many eateries in this picturesque Spanish-style street, which also provides access to family favourite Margaret Mahy Playground.
